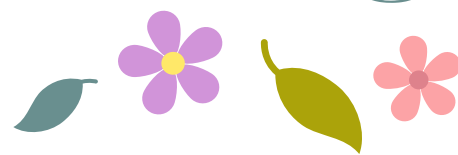
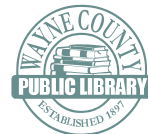
Don't Be a Couch Potato Aerobics

The **Skywarn™ spotter program** is a nationwide network of volunteers trained by the **National Weather Service (NWS)** to report significant weather. Anyone is welcome to participate. The NWS staff at the Cleveland Forecast Office in Ohio, are responsible for issuing warnings for most of Northern Ohio and Northwest Pennsylvania. It is impossible to observe conditions in each of these regions simultaneously during a severe weather event. Skywarn™ volunteers become our eyes and ears helping to provide better weather watch and warning services to the public. Information is relayed to the National Weather Service during tornadoes, severe thunderstorms, snow storms, flooding, and any other weather event that involves the use of volunteer storm spotters.
