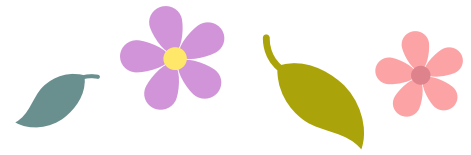

Storytime

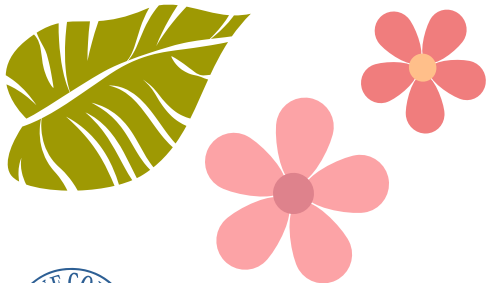
Saturday, April 8 at 12:30 PM
